3. FM system would be used in classrooms to reduce background noises. Noise absorbent materials would also be placed in classrooms (Carpets/ cushions). With reduced noises, hearing impaired children are able to hear clearer what their teachers or peers are trying to convey. Other children would also be less distracted and thus be able to focus on their own work.





2. Increased usage of videos with large font captioning and picture cards while teaching. Activities would be multi sensory so child with hearing impairment would feel included. Child understand through reading the words and the pictures.





With these changes, your child's learning potential would greatly increase!

HELPING THE HEARING IMPAIRED



What are the potential challenges that hearing impaired children faced in school?

How can we help these children learn better?





CHALLENGES

1. Child with hearing impairment might have speech and language delay due to the inability to listen and pronounce sight words correctly. This would result in child not being able to communicate and express himself verbally.

3. Child with hearing impairment might be unable to understand what teachers and peers said clearly due to the overwhelming noises in the environment. This might cause child to be confused and lost during class activities.







2. Child with hearing impairment might be excluded from peers due to the inability to communicate effectively (social skills). This would affect child's social emotional development as he might develop Low selfesteem.



4. Child with hearing impairment might not be on par with other children in terms of learning pace. Due to having minimal hearing, child would experience difficulties in keeping up with the lesson and activities in class.







1. Lights would be flashed to get the attention of the hearing impaired child. This would notify the child to be prepared to give his/her attention to the teacher. More time would be given more affected child to process and follow instruction.



4. More large group activities implemented to create a inclusive environment for affected child. Child with hearing impairment would be situated in-front of teacher when having large group activities. This would allow child to hear teacher's instruction clearer and would know if instruction is directed at him/her, because of eye contact being made with the child.
